### Promise of Forgiveness

**Hebrews 10:19-23**

*Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful.*

### Old Testament Reading

**Isaiah 28:14-29**

<sup>14</sup>Therefore hear the word of the Lord, you scoffers,  
who rule this people in Jerusalem!

<sup>15</sup>Because you have said, "We have made a covenant with death,  
and with Sheol we have an agreement,  
when the overwhelming whip passes through  
it will not come to us,

for we have made lies our refuge,  
and in falsehood we have taken shelter";

<sup>16</sup>therefore thus says the Lord God,  
"Behold, I am the one who has laid as a foundation in Zion,  
a stone, a tested stone,

a precious cornerstone, of a sure foundation:  
'Whoever believes will not be in haste.'

<sup>17</sup>And I will make justice the line,  
and righteousness the plumb line;  
and hail will sweep away the refuge of lies,  
and waters will overwhelm the shelter."

<sup>18</sup>Then your covenant with death will be annulled,

and your agreement with Sheol will not stand;  
when the overwhelming scourge passes through,  
you will be beaten down by it.

<sup>19</sup>As often as it passes through it will take you;  
for morning by morning it will pass through,  
by day and by night;  
and it will be sheer terror to understand the message.

<sup>20</sup>For the bed is too short to stretch oneself on,  
and the covering too narrow to wrap oneself in.

<sup>21</sup>For the Lord will rise up as on Mount Perazim;  
as in the Valley of Gibeon he will be roused;  
to do his deed—strange is his deed!  
and to work his work—alien is his work!

<sup>22</sup>Now therefore do not scoff,  
lest your bonds be made strong;  
for I have heard a decree of destruction  
from the Lord God of hosts against the whole land.

<sup>23</sup>Give ear, and hear my voice;  
give attention, and hear my speech.

<sup>24</sup>Does he who plows for sowing plow continually?  
Does he continually open and harrow his ground?

<sup>25</sup>When he has leveled its surface,  
does he not scatter dill, sow cumin,  
and put in wheat in rows  
and barley in its proper place,  
and emmer as the border?

<sup>26</sup>For he is rightly instructed;  
his God teaches him.

<sup>27</sup>Dill is not threshed with a threshing sledge,  
nor is a cart wheel rolled over cumin,  
but dill is beaten out with a stick,  
and cumin with a rod.

<sup>28</sup>Does one crush grain for bread?  
No, he does not thresh it forever;  
when he drives his cart wheel over it  
with his horses, he does not crush it.

<sup>29</sup>This also comes from the Lord of hosts;  
he is wonderful in counsel  
and excellent in wisdom.

### Affirmation of Faith

### Heidelberg Catechism Questions 31-32

Q. Why is He called Christ, that is, Anointed?

**A. Because He has been ordained by God the Father, and anointed with the Holy Spirit, to be our chief Prophet and Teacher, who has fully revealed to us the secret counsel and will of God concerning our redemption; our only High Priest, who by the one sacrifice of His body has redeemed us, and who continually intercedes for us before the Father; and our eternal King, who governs us by His Word and Spirit, and who defends and preserves us in the redemption obtained for us.**

Q. Why are you called a Christian?

**A. Because I am a member of Christ by faith and thus share in His anointing, so that I may as prophet confess His Name, as priest present myself a living sacrifice of thankfulness to Him, and as king fight with a free and good conscience against sin and the devil in this life, and hereafter reign with Him eternally over all creatures.**
