- ²⁵ The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.
- ²⁶ It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.
- ²⁷ It is good for a man that he bear

the yoke in his youth.

Congregational Meeting: The session is very encouraged to be able to call a congregational meeting on Thursday, December 17th at 7:00 pm for the purpose of holding an election for the following candidates for office in the church:

- Nick Thomson deacon

These men were nominated by the congregation during our nominating period in 2020, have received instruction in the offices, served an internship, and been examined and approved by the session as eligible for election. The meeting will take place via video-conference.

Additional Motion on Agenda: At the request of the deacons and with the approval of the session we are adding an additional item to the agenda for the congregational meeting: to give the deacons authority to sell or dispose of the church bells by whatever means they believe is most prudent. The reason for this motion is that our church bylaws require congregational approval for the sale of any church "property" in excess of \$10,000. The anticipated value of the bells is greater than that amount. The bells were removed from the tower several years ago and have been stored at Emerson Resources since that time. Reinstalling the

bells is neither financially nor structurally possible, and the bells can no longer be stored at Emerson. We will keep 3 of the smaller bells for possible historical and decorative work in the future.
